HEADTEACHER RECRUITMENT UPDATE from Lady Hayter, Chair of Governors - *As you all know, we have been working through the recruitment process for a new Headteacher to take over from Mrs. Smith. The Governors have received some applications and have shortlisted those we would like to interview, but the process has now been cut short by the school's closure. The governors have agreed a plan as it is unlikely we will have a new Headteacher in post in June. We are glad to be able to tell you that Mr. Smith has agreed to be appointed as Acting Headteacher for as long as necessary. Realistically this may be until Christmas, so we are fortunate to be able to give this temporary role to someone who knows the school, and whom we can trust to take it forward in these difficult times. We do have plans for a temporary teacher in Birch too but will share these in due course.*

Public Health England Education guidance

If you have a new and continuous cough or high temperature

stay at home for 7 days, if you live alone
stay at home for 14 days, if you live with others, including all household members

Only use NHS 111 if your symptoms get worse or are no better after home isolation

Stop the spread of coronavirus

Wash your hands more often and for 20 seconds

Use soap and water or a hand sanitiser when you:

- Get home or into work
- Blow your nose, sneeze or cough
- Eat or handle food

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue away straight away

Supervise young children to ensure they wash their hands more often than usual


e-Bug Posters and lesson plans on general hand hygiene can be found on the eBug website

Clean and disinfect regularly touched objects and surfaces more often than usual using your **standard cleaning products**

Staff, young people and children should stay at home if they are unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature to avoid spreading infection to others. Otherwise they should attend education or work as normal

If staff, young people or children become unwell on site with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature **they should be sent home**

Unless you have been directly advised to close by the local Public Health England Health Protection Team, we recommend all education settings remain open
