






Children will **only need to bring in lunch** (if not ordered through Fresh Start), a hat and appropriate raincoat if the weather is poor (no other book bags or rucksack are needed). We **won't be able to offer fruit** in the short term so children can bring a piece of fruit in a sandwich bag to eat a break-time.

We request that school uniform is to be worn by all, where possible, although **leniency will be given if items have been outgrown**. When wearing replacement clothes can we request they are plain and suitable for school. PE kits will not be needed but all children **can wear suitable footwear** for PE to school on their PE days.

What has been going on in the 'Four Kingdoms of School' this week?



In Oaken this week we have focussed on how to keep safe in the sun and have played with a lot of water! We conducted a science experiment to see if we could create bubbles in different shapes – the children made all sorts of shapes for their bubble wands but they still came out as spheres. We've also focussed on symmetry and doubles using butterflies as our inspiration.



In Birchleyville this week we have been so pleased to see a few more faces! The children are really enjoying being able to spend time together. This week we finished our Greek myths by each writing our own ending, a version of the scene between Perseus and Medusa. We included amazing similes and lots of action! In maths we tackled finding the area of triangles. In topic this week we have mainly been rehearsing our play, Greece Goes to Pieces. We also invented our own Greek Gods and Goddesses



We have been super busy in the kingdom of Ashrelia this week. We have been learning that exclamation marks are used when something is said forcefully, loudly or is a surprise, (BANG!) We have broadened our vocabulary in reading, (ask us to give you definitions for swooped, silent, flapped and branch.) We have learnt about pilgrimages to Mecca and have expanded our vocabulary even further with some really hard science words for the properties of materials. And then, in Maths we have learnt about grouping equally and arrays. We have worked SO hard that on Friday we awarded ourselves an art morning and made some fabulous art work in the style of Brazilian pop artist Romero Britto.




