IMPORTANT - Due to a child with a nut allergy we ask that no nuts are brought into school; please especially check Nutella, seeded bread and cereal bars.

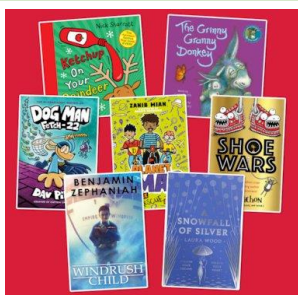

First Aid Minor Injury Procedures

We have updated our first aid procedures and how we report minor injuries to yourselves. Please carefully read the following:

- A member of staff will administer first aid for a minor injury. This may be cleaning up of a graze and or applying a plaster. (Pupils will be checked for any ongoing medical issue or allergy to plasters). Cold compress will be applied to any bumps or bangs to the head or face by a qualified first aider.
- Pupils in year 1-6 with any treated injury that is not a common cut or graze will be issued with a **yellow wristband** that will alert you that your child has received first aid.
- If a head/neck or face injury or an injury near or to a private part, then a text or phone call home will be made.
- Children in Reception will be issued with a **yellow wristband** to alert you of all proper first aid administered including cuts and grazes, to comply with EYFS standards (where blood is drawn or if a bruise is appearing).
- Staff will continue to monitor the children throughout the day and if needed will contact you again.
- You can then talk to your child about what happened and if you need further information you can speak to the office or class teacher by contacting school.

All accidents which are more than a cut or graze will be recorded in the First Aid book.

1. Open up the YouTube app and click your username located in the top right-hand corner
2. Tap to 'Settings'
3. Toggle the 'Restriction Mode' feature so it turns blue.
